Public Sector Climate Action

- Stay at home orders and operational continuity;

 - Avoid maladaption through carefully reviewing funding;
 - Feeling empowered to look at equity and environmental justice in a more holistic way;
 - Reframe funding/financing to directly benefit the broader discussion of resilience;
- Capacity building programs like CivicSpark fund, expand, and strengthen;
- We all have a role to play find the right fit and drive progress.
